

THE HORRY COUNTY JAIL

Made June 22, 1922, By Asst. Secretary H.C. Brearley.

The Horry jail is in practically its usual condition. Some additional blankets and a new kitchen stove have been purchased. The mattresses and covers are now clean and in good order, but removable covers should be made to protect the mattresses from dirt and rough usage.

The rooms used by white prisoners have no toilet facilities or stoves. They should be better equipped so that the whites can be strictly separated from the negroes as is required by law. The entire prisoners' quarters should be screened to protect the inmates from flies and mosquitoes. Only two meals are now supplied. If the dieting fee of fifty cents a day is not sufficient to provide them, the fees should be increased so that three wholesome meals can be served.
